NØLL Receives Award

Larry Lambert, NØLL, recently received his 488th 6meter QSL card from VE9IQ in grid FN67. His cards were checked Sept. 20, 2015. It took him 35 years to accomplish the feat. He will be the sixth person to receive the FFMA.

The Fred Fish Memorial Award was created in honor of Fred Fish, W5FF (SK), who is the first amateur to have worked and confirmed all 488 Maidenhead grid squares in the 48 contiguous US on 6 meters. The award will be given to any amateur who can duplicate W5FF's feat.

This award also encourages operation on the VHF bands from rare grid squares (known as Grid DXpeditions) to help activate all 488n grids.

The rules of FFMA closely follow the VUCC rules.



Silent Key K9RZ William 'Bill' Jackson

William "Bill" Jackson (K9RZ), 59, was born July 9, 1956. He died September 17, 2015. Bill worked for the Chicago and North Western Transportation Company and the Union Pacific Railroad for 34 years. He was also president of the Heartland DX Assoc.

Bill grew up in Wheaton, Illinois and in 1983 moved to Chadron, Nebraska to set up the communications system for the C & NW line going into the coal mines in the Powder River Basin. There he met Karen and they were married July 26, 1986. After the Chadron Railroad office was shut down in 1991, we moved back to the suburbs of Chicago. In 1995, we came to Omaha with the Union Pacific Railroad.

Bill is survived by his wife, Karen Jackson; brother, Peter (Mary) Jackson of Spokane, Washington; nephews, Colin Jackson of Spokane, Washington and Evan (Paige) Jackson of Eugene, Oregon; aunt, Mary Carlson of Marietta, Georgia; and mother-in-law, Joan Johns of Gering; and numerous cousins.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Ginny and Bill Sr. and a brother, Thomas.

Visitation will begin at 6 p.m. followed by a memorial service at 7 p.m. Wednesday, September 23, 2015, at John A. Gentleman Mortuaries 72nd Street Chapel.

Graveside services will be at Creighton Valley Cemetery in Gering at a later date.
