# A Ham Biography!

At 10 years old I was an electrical geek always messing around with electricity. Being very interested in radio I had much fun playing with "Broadcasters" (Low power transmitters on the AM radio band). I did not have many listeners though and I was not satisfied with the range that I was getting out in the rural area where we lived. After increasing my power and antenna size, I got more attention than I had intended! The sheriff came out to visit my Dad and that ended my days of bootleg radio. They confiscated my junk and the term "Clandestine radio" was added to my vocabulary.!

After hearing about "HAM" radio I joined the radio code class that Tom Shires-WØFXH {SK} was running at the Navy Reserve radio center at Midland college. We learned the code the "Navy Way" starting at 15 words per minute! It was late 1963 when I finally passed the code test and the Novice theory test and received the call sign WNØHAL.

My first transmitter was a home brew rig built on a bread board with no shielding using an 807 tube final driven by a 6AG7 crystal oscillator and a large old junk TV chassis power supply with a 5U4G rectifier running 500 volts. WOW! The

thing made 45 watts output, or so I thought, and clobbered all the TV channels in town. ! We were in a channel 3 fringe TV area at the time so I was not allowed to transmit at all during prime TV time. I had a lot of effort and parts in that rig but I saved up my lawn mowing money all summer and hitched a ride to Council Bluffs, Iowa to get to that famous radio Mecca "W R L" {World Radio Laboratories}. There I was able to buy a well shielded Johnson transmitter that worked quite well, used the same tubes and had a metal cabinet so I would not electrocute myself.

I finally got a working station on the air with the help of Tom-KØJFN {SK} and had fun working CW with an 80 /40 trap doublet antenna and a J-37 telegraph key. My mother was an artist and painted the picture of my first station. The receiver is a Hallicrafters S-107 with Heathkit Q-multiplier and the later transmitter was a Johnson Adventurer.

Got to thinking back about the license classes and realized that 6 of the original 8 guys in Tom Shires 1963 Novice class are now {SK} or "Silent keys". Kind of scary!
