An Interesting Bit Of Information!

February 18-19, 2017

Late Saturday afternoon, during the ARRL WW CW contest, I noticed the meter on my HyGain rotor control was bouncing around. Initially thought it was due to wind, then noticed it was not very windy.

When I tried to turn my yagi from Europe to Asia, the meter jumped around, so much, that I could not determine its direction. I had to look out the window to determine the direction. The meter showed 190-degrees, but the antenna direction was around 310-degrees.

It appeared the direction potentiometer failed, or the top of the rotor housing had come loose.

It was dusk, so not light enough to see what had happened. Decided to look into it in the morning.

I started back, in the contest, around 7:30 am and worked a few Europeans, then it was time to head to Weston for their 'pancake feed'. Great breakfast!

On returning home, it was time to look into the problem. I headed to the tower base to open the large, waterproof box, housing coax connections

and the rotor cable. When I got the box open, there was a monster 'mouse nest' covering roughly half the box. Naturally, a couple of our cats were with me to supervise!

While clearing out the nest, I noticed a 'mouse tail' sticking out of the mess. Using my Leatherman pliers I gently tried to pick up the, what I thought was a dead mouse.

Surprise! It wasn't dead. It jumped out of the box and with one of the cats in hot pursuit. Don't know if it caught the mouse.

It took quite a while to clear the mess. Dirty and smelly!

When I came back in the house, I immediately checked the operation and alignment of the rotor control box. It was back to normal. Evidently the nest was intermittently shorting the wires from the potentiomenter.

Due to the events of last fall and winter, I had neglected to inspect the box. I usually wait until there are a couple freezes, since I have been surprised by wasps building their nests in them.
