ADJOURN: The meeting was adjourned at 735 PM.



Contest Is On for January

The ARRL January VHF Contest is on. I just made 2 contacts, one on 144 and one on 432 SSB with W0LGQ in Crescent IA.

Nothing fantastic about that except for the usual lack of mid-west stations on the air. And the contacts were made using my eFactor dual-band antenna 8 feet off the ground!

Last years Nebraska winner in the contest was N2VHZ in western Nebraska with 1 contact. Fire up those rigs!



After spending some time yesterday (Sunday) trying to make a contact on 2 meter SSB during the ARRL VHF Contest with long-time friend Ray, WB0HHM in Sioux Falls, we finally gave up and settled for a good conversation using the old method,

the land-line. Ray told me that there was not a lot of VHF/UHF SSB activity in South Dakota either, but that Ed, W0SD and Don, AA0F, and others were trying to change that.

There is a 2 meter SSB Net on Sunday evenings on 144.270 MHz. The equipment is located at a repeater site near Wessington Springs SD and is operated remotely.

Last night I listened. When Ray texted me that the antenna was pointed toward me, I did hear faint voices but not near enough for a contact.

So, I plan to (1) raise my antenna, and/or add my beam (2) listen again on Sunday evenings.

Give it a try. Maybe we can get more VHF/UHF SSB activity going in Nebraska as well.

Wind Not A Friend To Antenna

So much for fiberglass poles holding up in strong winds without guying. The joints on two poles failed. The strongest winds at the Fremont Airport when the pole went down were 35 mph, although it has gusted to 41 mph since.

I had a 6 meter loop and dual band 144/440 on the mast only up about 20 feet. The 6 meter antenna is bent but can be straightened. The 144/440 antenna is ok.

This was just a temporary lash-up to begin with but I will have to re-think my arrangement. I should have kept the aluminum poles and got rid of the fiberglass.

Just something I want to toss out here.... Just wondering if anyone was thing about doing something for winter field day? There is some info on it in QST.


