The FCC approved the PARC call sign change to K0SW on August 6. Our web site was changed to reflect that change. The domain K0SW.org was purchased from GoDaddy.

It took a few days to get both domains to access our web site. One may now connect using the original www.k0jfn.com or by using the redirected link www.k0sw.org. Access is also available using k0jfn.com or k0sw.org.

Access will remain available using these URLs until January 2020 when our hosting needs to be renewed. Since there is no need to pay for hosting of two domains, in January, the hosting of k0jfn will be dropped, and a "domain name account change' request will be made for k0sw.org.

It enables the participants to begin developing an ICS/EOC interface for their community by applying Incident Command System (ICS) principles. The course reviews ICS and EOC responsibilities and functions and depends heavily on exercise and group discussions to formulate the interface.


