MINUTES AND TREASURER'S REPORT: Approved as printed in October PARC News. MOTION TO PAY BILLS: None.

HOSPITALITY: Chairperson Sharon Martens, KB0TVB sent a card and \$25 memorial to the family of member Michael Fairlie, W0MF, who died on September 26. (Anybody knowing of somebody needing a card should let KB0TVB know. Her email address is posted on the PARC website.)

EDUCATION: None.

The training is for all PARC members who are or want to be a part of the ARES response to an emergency in Dodge County. They need to understand the new Communications System for the County. They may be asked to be a volunteer who has both an ARES radio and the new County Radio.
