#### PIONEER AMATEUR RADIO CLUB AGENDA October 23, 2025

The October 23, 2025 Pioneer Amateur Radio Club Meeting was held at Gambino's Pizza in Fremont. The meeting was called to order at 7 P.M. by President Steve Narans, WB0VNF.

20 amateurs introduced themselves, and Zach Young, NØRUS, introduced his guest, Carly.

The minutes were approved as reported in the August P.A.R.C. News.

Treasurer, Sharon Martens, KBØTVB, gave the monthly report and it was approved. There were no bills.

For hospitality, Sharon reported a sympathy card was sent to Tim Kresky, ABØS, for passing of his mother.

In education: Zach reported at the CERT training on Tuesday they went over the ORI-ON radio system and Tom Smith, Emergency Manager, had them do an exercise Zach thought we may be able to use with our upcoming youth education. They would community in two locations. Each would have a paper grid, and one would have symbols and indicate where the other should mark an item, such as there is a triangle at C1. Another activity was for one to have a drawing, and the other person would have to duplicate the shapes, sizes, and locations on the paper to match the directions given.

Steve and Jane Mehaffey, KBØZUN, reported on the positive feedback they each received when contacting the area schools. Steve contacted Arlington, Bergan, and Fremont Middle School, and all were interested. Jane contacted North Bend Central and Scribner-Snyder, and they were very receptive. It was suggested by Darlene Hoffman, NØLOP, to add the Cedar Bluff School to the list. Jane volunteered to contact them. Steve also mentioned contacting Trinity. Zach suggested creating a military style actionpacked video like in the past that showed radio not strictly for communication but as science and it's an art. Literally starting with the heavens and radio signals bouncing of the moon, the ISS, and moving down into the atmosphere to use this technology to have direction finding, amateur TV, and radio is available when cell phone and computers are not in operation, etc. to simulate their interest and excite them to want to explore these topics. Next step ideas: a preset fox hunt or a communication with hams nearby. Then we need class options ready to study for license. Several options are available and were discussed. Maybe end with a survey, asking the student to list which type of learning they would like to pursue for feedback, if interested. Have a list of resources available, and perks to keep them when they get a license.

**Field Day:** Brian Cooper volunteered to again host the 2026 Field Day. Chair Tony Renze, KØOMH, stated there were no additional details. Tony and Wes, KD0PGV spoke briefly about winter field day.

**Flea Market:** Chair Rich Mehaffey, KBØARZ, reported we will now have to set up for the 2026 Flea Market. The city is no longer doing this due to the retirement of a part-time helper and surgery by a full-time staff member. It was discussed about asking for a discount if we have to set up.
