PIONEER AMATEUR RADIO CLUB MINUTES FOR February 27, 2025

The Pioneer Amateur Radio Club Meeting for February 27, 2025 was held at Gambino's Pizza in Fremont. The meeting was called to order at 7 p.m. by President Steve Narans, WB0VNF. A Moment of Silence was held in honor of silent keys Dave Theophilus, WØNRW, and Jack Pawley, WAØSAQ, and former member Dale Heitshusen, KØTPN.

27 members and guests were present, who introduced themselves. The meeting proceeded with a program given by Wes, KDØPGV, and Steve Narans, WBØVNF highlighting the Winter Field Day on January 25 - 26, 2025. Wes Chrisman, KD0PGV, YXL Amy, KF0GCN, and daughter Maddie, Steve Narans, WB0VNF and YXL Mary, Chuck Narans, KFØAFJ, YXL Becky, and their son Mason, Jarad Chrisman, KDØEFC, XYL Kate Chrisman, KDØSPD, and their son Warren, Tony Renze, KØOMH, and Don Renze, KØOM, participated at Platte River State Park near Louisville, NE. The presenters shared photos and positive comments about their experiences. In addition, several hams participated from different locations. Wesley Payne, KEØWHA, and Nina Stark, KØNSS, operated from their tent at Halsey, while several others worked the event from home stations. MINUTES: With the passing of Dave Theophilus, WØNRW, there were no January minutes printed in the February *PARC News*.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Approved as printed in the February *PARC News.* <u>Bills:</u> Rich was paid \$250 for the brick we purchased from ARRL. HOSPITALITY: Sharon Martens, KBØTVB, shared she had sent a lot of cards, this was a busy month. A thank you was received from Linda Kirchmann, WØZIP, for the memorial given in remembrance of her husband Bob, WØICE.

EDUCATION: none

FIELD DAY: Tony reported that Field Day will be held at a location provided by Brian Cooper, KD5RXP. Steve, WBØVNF, reported the ARES Trailer will not be on site as previously discussed as the location indicates there will probably not be many of the public in attendance.

FLEA MARKET: The flea market will be held on July 12, 2025, in North Bend with Rich Mehaffey, KB0ARZ, and Jane Mehaffey, KBØZUN, as Chairpersons. Ross Mehaffey will also be leading the kitchen crew. Darlene, NØLOP, and Sharon, KBØTVB, are willing to be the cashiers for that portion of the event. Rich and Jane have prepared the post-cards for mailing. They just need the address side completed for mailing closer to the event. Rich asked if anyone would be willing to step up to take Dave and Mel's, WØNRW and NØVLA, place at the door to collect admissions. Gary Wiese, KBØKYM, who also had prior experience at this spot, and Amy Chrisman, KFØGCN, offered to work in this area. The group expressed interest again in having Monty Wilson, NRØA, of Norfolk to lead the testing

PICNIC: More information will be forthcoming in the future concerning the September 21, 2025 event scheduled to begin at 5 PM.

CHRISTMAS PARTY: Will be at Farmer Brown's in Waterloo at 5 p.m. on Saturday, December 6, 2024, with Jane Mehaffey, KB0ZUN and Pat Bahl as Chairpersons. Some prizes have already been collected and one activity is already planned.

NET MANAGER: Gary Wiese, KBØKYM, net manager reported which Net Control slots were available and volunteers filled in the open dates through the first week of April.

ARES: Steve Narans, WBØVNF, stated that Gary, KBØKYM, would need a backup for weather nets. Wes, KDØPGV, volunteered for the position. Steve also introduced Jim Nelson, WØJRN, the Southeast District Representative for the Nebraska ARES. Jim spoke about NWS-Chat 2.0, which brings you virtually into National Weather Service (NWS) operations powered by Slack, as a realtime instant messaging program. This allows your local NWS office to communicate weather and flood information with key partners during incidents.

PUBLICITY: In new business, with the passing of Dave Theophilus, a new publicity person will need to be appointed, volunteered, or voted on.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS: KBØARZ reported he completed the paperwork for the \$250 ARRL brick with our club information, he wrote his check for the purchase to headquarters. Our club will receive a paper certificate of the brick inscription at no additional charge. Lance was not present to report on any findings about club badges.

NEW BUSINESS: A motion was made by Sharon Martens, KBØTVB, and seconded to have Jane Mehaffey, KBØZUN, finish the 2025 year as recording secretary for P.A.R.C. with Dave's other responsibilities to be decided separately. The position of publicity chair will need a volunteer, be appointed, or voted on and was tabled until the next meeting. Several spotter training dates were announced. Our local Dodge County night is scheduled for March 31 at the Scribner Fire Station.

DRAWING: New member Kyler Bowling, KFØMMT, drew for the \$10, the winner was Arnie Grubbs, KAØNCR. **ANNOUNCEMENTS:** Ross Mehaffey, KØARZ, said that when he contacted P & H Electric in Fremont about obtaining a few feet of 15-gauge magnet wire, he was told he could have it at no charge. Upon picking it up and confirming it with the business, he was gifted with a six-pound spool rather than just a few feet. Having brought the roll with him, he urged anyone needing a piece for a project was invited to take what they wanted. About a half dozen hams took him up on his offer. The next meeting will be held on Thursday, March 27, 2025.

ARRL has released the logo and theme for this year's ARRL Field Day, June 28-29, 2025.

The theme is "Radio Connects" highlighting the many ways that wireless technology connects people across distances near and far. The event is part picnic, campout, practice for emergencies, informal contest, and most of all, fun! ARRL Field Day is the most popular ham radio activity held annually in the US and Canada. On the fourth weekend in June each year, more than 31,000 hams get together with their radio clubs, schools, or friends to operate from remote locations.

Ham radio provides a connection both for practical com-

munications and to form relationships with fellow radio amateurs. No matter who you are, or what your background or interests are, if you have an interest in radio and wireless technology, radio connects you with others.



The theme is universal, Local amateur

radio clubs bridge generations. Contacts made across town or around the world allow cultural exchange, right over the air. In times of crisis, radio connects those in need with information. The whole point of amateur radio is the connect, both literally and figuratively. Amateur radio also inspire the next generation of technical leaders by providing a hands on sandbox where students can gain experience in the fields of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM).
